THE HEARTBEAT

“The Real Thing”

I know, the first place your mind went to was to Coca-Cola. It's funny, our minds are programmed to follow a path when we hear a few words, smell a particular smell, or hear a song from the past. They bring up old memories by way of a memory trace. These “traces” are chemically set, and why smells set the strongest memory trace of all. It is the real deal!

What I want to think about is not the real thing, but exactly opposite of that, which is the artificial thing, or that which is not real. I can remember sitting at my grandparents' table when I was young, seeing the bottle of artificial sweetener. My grandmother was diagnosed with Type-II diabetes, and the doctor told her to replace her sugar intake with the over-the-counter sugar substitute. Now we know the earlier versions of sugar substitutes contained saccharin, a chemical linked to cancer in laboratory rats. This research was found only when they administered high doses of course, but what happens to the human body when this substitute sweetener is used in everything – or in high doses? What we know now is a better substitute sweetener can be found naturally in plants called Stevia, which is much safer.

Not all substitutes are better. Take for instance nylon. It is much more comfortable to wear, but is a natural fiber such as cotton a better fiber to use? Get to close to a fire and the answer becomes clear. And what about wool? Sure, there are man-made fibers that can keep individuals warm in cold weather, but there is a reason wool has stood the test of time in northern climates when it comes to coats, hats, and sweaters. Natural fibers just seem to work better than the substitutes.

As our technology increases, we think (no pun intended) opportunities increase across the board. What I mean by that is avenues to attain the same result. Take the analogy of going from point A to point B, say Memphis to Nashville, Tennessee. There is one straight shot on Interstate 40, but there is a multitude of other roads by which one could go from point A to point B, with each one taking a different route. But in all the myriads of routes, each one would end in Nashville, Tennessee and would therefore seem to be successful routes. But what if there were specific conditions placed on the ways the traveler must travel, such as time or location?

There is a falsehood being perpetuated in our society today that there are many avenues by which a person can be allowed to enter heaven. “Oh, I'm a good person, and I know God will let me in.” If this were true, entrance would be performance based, which is the perpetuated lie.

Jesus said, “I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one comes to the Father except through Me.” As a man attending Harvard asked the Rev. Billy Graham at a huge conference in front of a multitude of people, “Sir, what must I do to attain eternal life?” His answer was the same as Peter's after his great sermon on Solomon's Colonnade. “Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved.” It is the age-old answer and is the age-old real thing

Boys & Girls Club Meal Sign-up for January




